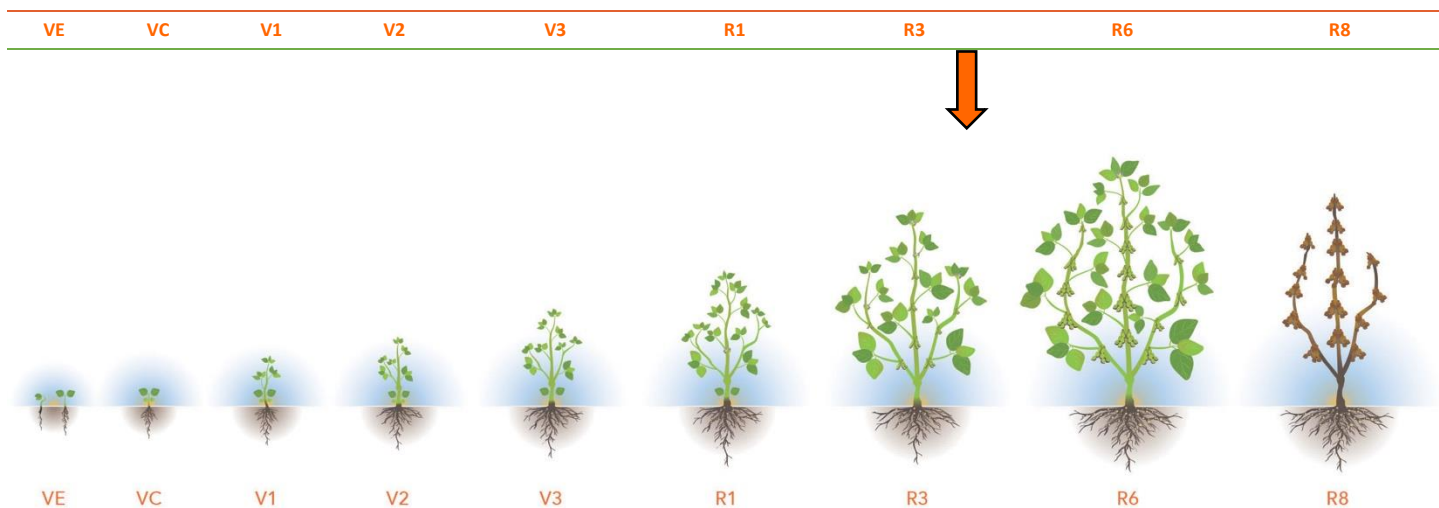

## GLOBALLY

The month of July was the month with the most amount of rain since 1972. Lot of fields have been soaked for a couple days. We see lot of variability in a lot of fields and lots of yellow spots. The soybean is very tall because of all the rain. We began to see some disease in the field. Major diseases seen were white mould and *Phytophthora*. Flowering is almost done, and pods are now filling.

Fields are mostly clean with the 2<sup>nd</sup> spraying, and we do not see weeds right in the fields.

No aphids or any problematic insects this year. The major issue as we wrote in the first paragraph will be some diseases.
